

Youth United Anti Bullying Film Festival - February 24, 2012

Contest Rules & Submission Details

1. All submitted videos should address the topic of "Anti-Bullying" and be in the form of a Public Service Announcement (PSA). Please keep videos to an appropriate nature. Entries with inappropriate content (e.g. offensive language, nudity) will not be screened.
2. Videos must be exactly 30 seconds in length to be eligible for 1st place prize (CTV air time).
3. The contest is open to youth living in the Greater Victoria area between the ages of 9-18 yrs who are affiliated with one of the community centres listed below. As this is a youth film festival we ask that parents, teachers and other adults assisting in the production limit their involvement. Youth are responsible for the planning, filming and editing of their work.
4. All videos must be submitted via USB flash drive in .AVI or .MPEG format. In order for a PSA to be broadcast on TV, it is imperative the video is in either Standard Definition (720 x 486 or 480 pixels) or in High Definition (1920 x 1080 or 1280 x 720 pixels). All submissions must include an attached registration form and signed media release forms. These documents can be obtained through one of the following locations:

5. All entries should be submitted by no later than 12:00pm Wednesday, February 22nd to the above locations.
6. Contestants may enter as many films as they wish to the contest. A completed registration form is required for each entry submitted.

7. All entries will be screened at the Youth United 2012 Anti-Bullying Film Festival event on February 24th at the Harbourside Esquimalt Boys and Girls Club (410 Macaulay Street) from 7pm – 9pm. Contestants will be given the opportunity to introduce their group members and the title of their film.

8. A panel of judges will assess the PSA using the following criteria:

- Ability to convey Anti-bullying message
- Creativity/Originality
- Production Quality
- Overall Best Film
